Following the granting of a licence by Wokingham Borough Council for the new public toilet to be sited in the town centre (at the southern end) the Town Council has placed an order for the unit. Latest information indicates that there will be a 12 week lead in time and we hope that the new facility will be in use by the summer.

Former Horticultural Shed makes way for new Woodley Pre School building

In February we said a fond farewell to a building in Woodford Park that was the centre of the Woodley Horticultural Society's activities from 1969 up until the winding up of the society in 2010. The Horticultural Shed has been demolished to make way for Woodley Pre School's new modular building which will sit on the shed's former site and should be open for business at the beginning of the summer term.

The shed was the trading centre for the society which had 2,000 members at its height and organised many social and horticultural events for members including garden competitions, dances, lectures and quizzes as well as visits to gardens and historical sites. Mr Tony Burden held the position of Trading Manager from 1973 to 2010 and was supported in this by his wife, Pat, and other long-term members of the society.



Bulmershe Leisure Centre – new beginning

Plans are underway to replace the existing leisure centre on Woodlands Avenue with a modern building which will include a 6-lane swimming pool and a teaching pool, a gym and 4-court sports hall along with a studio and a café. Wokingham Borough Council has appointed a new social enterprise leisure contractor, Places for People Leisure, who will run the new centre once it is open.

The centre will close on 27 April and removal of internal fittings will be carried out, with the demolition of the building taking place in the summer holidays so as not to impact on the nearby schools and their students. Once the plans have been approved, work will start on the new building. It is estimated that the total project will take 18 – 24 months.

Bulmershe Leisure Centre was built by Berkshire County Council and opened in 1971. The Town Council funded the centre's public leisure provision until 1995 when it then took over the running of the centre under a lease agreement. 1Life has been running the centre since 2014 when the centre transferred back to Wokingham BC.



Festival of Business Woodley

Last October's Festival was reported to be the most successful to date. The event, sponsored by Mass Media Design, attracted a record number of 40 exhibitors and 140 attendees and enabled exhibitors to showcase their business and products to a large number of local businesses. Speakers covered topics relating to websites, social media, HMRC changes to digital tax and the design and development of the Sittingwell cushion. The organisers thanked Woodley Town Council for the use of the Oakwood Centre and Addington School, Cozzie, Waitrose, Greggs and Red Rose Indian Restaurant who all provided refreshments at the event.

Woodley and North Earley Community Forum – Annual General Meeting

The new Woodley and North Earley Community Forum will be holding its first Annual General Meeting (AGM) at 7.30pm on Thursday, 12 April 2018 at the Oakwood Centre. The forum has been set up by Thames Valley Police, local residents and representatives of local organisations with the aim of working together to reduce crime in our communities. At its first meeting last June the local policing priorities included antisocial behaviour, illegal encampment, bicycle theft, theft from cars and speeding. Progress on all these issues has been made. Agreed priorities for the first quarter of 2018 are antisocial behaviour, speeding and protection of vulnerable people from computer fraud and telephone scamming. Residents of Woodley and North Earley who would like to contribute to the discussions on local policing would be welcome to attend the AGM and future scheduled meetings of the forum.

Readibus in Woodley

The Town Council supports the availability of the Readibus service in Woodley. This alternative bus service is available to residents with restricted mobility, such as elderly and disabled people, who are not able to make a bus journey using mainstream buses. Bus journeys with Readibus are door-to-door and are shared with other users of the service. There is no fare to pay if you have a bus pass.

One resident told us, "Readibus means freedom to me. I don't know what I'd do without it. I meet new friends on the bus. I'm over 80 now and many of my friends have moved or died so it is easy to become isolated and it is a terrible thing – isolation. Everybody I speak to says the same about Readibus, we chat to each other and I look forward to going on the bus. We go via lots of places so it makes it interesting. I have had nothing but kindness from the drivers, they have such patience and are really very kind. Readibus is definitely my lifesaver."
